Discussion

Barb Ruzic has proposed the club purchase a Baby Lock Meridian Embroidery machine. She says this machine will give us many years of happiness in our club. This machine has a large throat for large quilts. It also has a large hoop. This machine has the ability to digitize from scratch.

She took over the Meg group last November and she has trained 9 new members to use our embroidery machine. We have 57 active members in our machine embroidery group. The machine we have now is twelve years old.

She has increased club income \$1900.00 towards a new machine and plans on selling the one in the club for about \$1500. So about \$3500.00 will be going towards our new Meridian.

She got a great price from Central Sewing Center in Prescott, Az. He will give us two years of free service and he will pick up and deliver. He has also offered us as many classes as needed to learn the machine.

The price he gave us \$4100.00

The board has voted yes, to move forward with this proposal.

We have set up electronic voting procedure through the rec center. We will only receive the final tally.
