<u>Program:</u> John Teixeira, Assistant Fire Marshal from Arizona Fire & Medical Authority, spoke to us about AED handling in emergencies:

- 1. Call 911 (our bulletin board has the correct address)
- 2. Get AED, located near the bathrooms near RnS
- 3. Turn it on and follow directions—open shirt, attach pads per illustration, clear hands off, machine will determine whether to shock.
- 4. May ask for CPR—compressions only, 30 seconds

Fire Dept. has an average 4-minute response time.

If you feel the need to purchase your own AED for home (about \$1800), ask your cardiologist for a prescription. AED.com, Zoll brand is easy to use.

A Lucas device, a vest that does compressions, is now available on fire trucks for professionals to use on patients.

John answered many questions. If you have gas fuel in your home, you need a carbon monoxide detector, mounted low.

The fire department has an ambulance transport membership program for \$83 per year for your household. Check your insurance carrier to learn what they cover for transport to hospitals before you take steps to sign up for this local program.
